Bristol Churches Winter Night Shelter

Over fourteen weeks from January to April 2020, churches in Bristol will once again open their doors as part of the Bristol Churches Winter Night Shelter (BCWNS) project. Adopting the [Housing Justice](#) model for church based shelters, a significant contribution is made to reducing rough sleeping in Bristol.

In order to support the planning and delivery of this project we are looking to appoint a **Deputy Project Co-ordinator**.

Working under the guidance of the BCWNS Project Coordinator (who is line-managed by the Chief Executive of [Crisis Centre Ministries](#)) this role and the project present a significant opportunity for the church community to once again participate in addressing one of the city's greatest challenges.

Working on a self-employed basis, you will support the planning stages inclusive of volunteer recruitment and training, and venue readiness; you will support the operational phase deputising for the Coordinator in their absence; and assist with project evaluation and wrap-up tasks. This will be a challenging yet rewarding role with varying demands on time and energy during the different project phases.

- *Fee - rate of £10 per hour paid against invoiced hours worked.*
- *Hours - part-time, with varying daily commitment during the different phases of the project. Estimated total hours = 400.*
- *Duration – immediate start; until the completion of the evaluation phase in July 2019.*
